From Tragedy to Triumph:

A Family's Road to Recovery After the Allentown Fire

In April 2024, a massive fire devastated the 700 block of North 7th Street near Tilghman Street in Allentown, displacing at least 36 residents. Several rowhomes were destroyed, leaving families searching for temporary shelter and facing the daunting task of rebuilding their lives. We were privileged to work with one of the first families displaced by the fire.

This family of eight—two sisters, a husband, and children from both families—arrived at the Sixth Street Shelter on May 22, 2024. During their stay, they faced another tragedy when one of the sisters suffered a personal loss. We provided support and recommended counseling to help them through their emotional and familial devastation.

We connected them with community resources, and thanks to the relationships our Shelter staff have with Bridgeside Estates (formerly Little Lehigh Subsidized Housing), we secured permanent housing for them. In June, the family and their Case Manager submitted the application for the newly renovated properties.

On July 29, their application was approved! The next day, they signed their lease and received the keys to their new home. With the emergency support provided by the Sixth Street Shelter, they saved enough for the security deposit and first month's rent. By the end of August, they moved into a newly renovated 4-bedroom, 1.5-bath home with subsidized rent, turning the page after monumental challenges.
